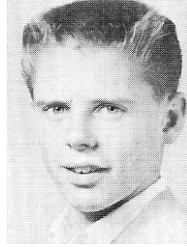

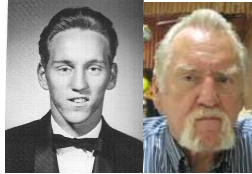

It's hotter than hades here....everything is DRY. We are breaking all sorts of temperature records for June. But at least it's not humid... PJ

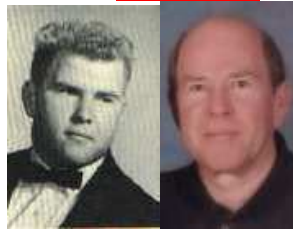

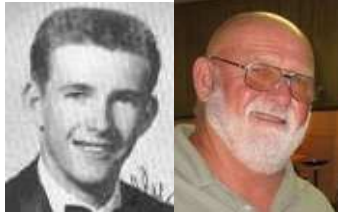

“Many people look forward each summer to the Perseids. It’s a great time to go camping. This shower always peaks around this time of year, and in years when the moon is out of the sky, it reliably produces 50 or more meteors per hour at its peak at northerly latitudes, or an average of about one a minute. Fortunately, the rather thin waning crescent moon in the predawn hours won’t really intrude too greatly on

the 2012 Perseid shower. Instead, the moon will enhance the show, guiding your eye to the sky's two brightest planets, Venus and Jupiter, and to the constellation Orion in your eastern sky. If you live in Indonesia, you may even see the moon occult – cover over – Jupiter before sunrise on Sunday, August 12.” You can set your clock by it every year on August 12.
