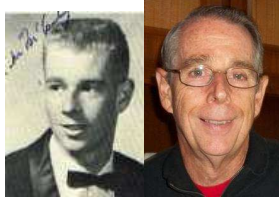

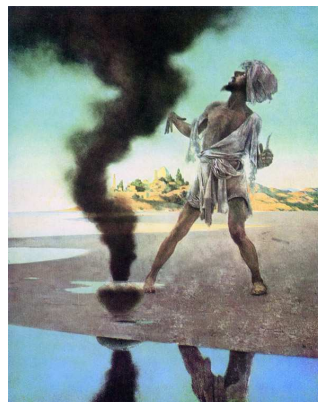
I found this little blurb about my Great Grandfather online...

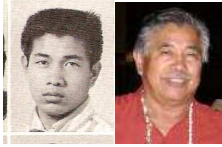
My family moved to Castroville from Radcliff, Ky. in March, 1963. As a junior at North Salinas High School then, I did not know many people in the area. I did hang
