








IN MEMORIAM

But I did take a few hours on my birthday and went on a tour of the Seattle Aquarium. <u>But not just any tour – this included a behind-the scenes look</u> at the food prep, pumps, filters, and dive systems. It takes quite an approval system to get the full tour approved by the brass (contamination and in-the-way concerns), but a couple of our higher up the ladder club volunteers persuaded them to donate a tour to our dive club banquet raffle. We won and got a great escorted visit. Technically we won a tour for four, which we figured for Mary, myself, and our two foster kids; but then son Ben

showed up on his way from Maui to Alaska and was able to join us. He's gone down a rung or two, from boat captain of a 60 ft, 139 pax snorkeling boat, to a licensed deckhand on a 230 ft ship taking only 86 pax on adventure tours of Alaska. His captain license (tonnage etc OK to run the ship, but not the experience) is used to run the small boats that take pax to shore for hiking and sightseeing. Anyway – they just made it a tour for 5 at the aquarium, so it all worked out well.

I was out of diving and flying for a few months with <u>cataract surgeries and stomach surgery</u>, but now all is well and healed and I'm back doing both. I dove a week ago, and passed the flight physical and have flown about 20 kids for Young Eagle flights, and flew to San Juan Island for lunch Saturday. <u>Spent all day today tearing the plane apart and putting it back together for the annual inspection.</u> The inspector is a good friend and past partner on this plane, so it went well.

I gave an unusual presentation at the Marine Science Technology center a couple weeks ago. I've been a "guest lecturer" there before (branch of Highline Community College) on taking underwater video, but this was a hands-on seminar. I brought some of my hi def video cameras, tripods, lights, etc and made a rough outline, then the "audience" went out and shot video per the rough script. Afterwards over the next week I edited and made a short promo video for the MaST center. I added a couple interviews I shot before, and some in and underwater footage, and just today got the OK from those who reviewed it to make it public.

Lots of editing, but it came out OK, for totally amateur camera operators, minimal script, no pro microphone system, etc. The participants had fun. See it here:

Each plane and pilot is different, but those I fly usually have the controls for most of the flight. It's easy if you don't have to worry about the radio, airspace, controllers, landing, etc.

So if anyone knows kids 8 to 17 in the Puget Sound area –

I fly to pick up Young Eagles!!

Or – come on up here to the Pacific Northwest!!

They say flying is the 2nd greatest thrill in life. Landing is the first.






