By following the website, you'll know <u>everything you need to know</u> about the weekend events, long before the formal invitation is mailed to you.



My gal-friends attended SHS and are interested in attending (know lots of NSHS '64 graduates); and wonder if you could add them to your mail list? Here are their names and emails:






both schools in an accelerated class. I wish someone had written the names on the back of the picture, but no such luck. A few faces are familiar.


In May, Steve started another round of chemo, for his lung cancer which has gone from Level 4 to Level 2.

Let it go on record, that staying connected is the best part of growing old and because of the NSHS newsletters, we are still connected."





**REMEMBERING MERLE D. PEARSON, JR.** 



May 22, 1946 - March 13, 1965

"Merle "Bubby" Pearson (NSHS 1964) was one of those guys who contracted the fatal Fort Ord Spinal Meningitis Disease and died within 24 hours of diagnosis ...his body temperature reached nearly 110 degrees (I think). It was a real shock to family, friends and those of us who, in one way or another, were closely connected to him. Many of us had to get those very gnarly inoculation injections ...that hurt like hell ...but undoubtedly and thankfully prolonged our lives. During that time, he was dating Cheryl Steiner (SHS '66) whom he nicknamed "Pinky". If I remember correctly, Bubby's younger sister, Kris was born the year he died. In fact, my sister, Janice and Kris's mother, Tat shared the same maternity room at SVMH, so my niece, Kimberly and Kris were born on the same day. Kris and my wife, Glenda, are cousins.

We've seen Kris at a couple of family functions this year, and she mentioned it'd be nice to speak with a few of her brother's classmates and former friends, to perhaps learn more information about him, his personality, etc. I'm sure it'd be a very positive event for her.

Even though Merle ('64) and I ('65) were in different classes we used to pal around quite a bit. He and I went to the same church; and, even though I never dated his sister Dayna, I had a huge crush on her and managed to hang-out at their home as often as possible. At that point in time, Merle and I were one of the hand-full of guys at our church in our age group who had cars ...we ended up double-dating quite a bit with several different girls and spent lots of time in the Monterey, Carmel, Big Sur areas ...best place(s) in the world to take dates. Remember those days(?) ...a time in history when boys and girls dated many different people, unless they were "steadies" ...it's not like that today; where dating is strictly a one-on-one / "hook up" basis. Kids today don't know what they're missin'. Vou may have known Merle Dayna and Kris's mom Pauline "Tat" Pearson she

You may have known Merle, Dayna and Kris's mom, <u>Pauline "Tat" Pearson</u>, she was one of the main librarians at the Salinas Valley Library, and she was the <u>librarian at the small branch on North Main</u>, up from <u>Ron's Market</u>. She is also one of the most respected Steinbeck historians in the world. Tat currently lives in an assisted-care facility in Salinas. Merle Pearson Sr. (92) currently lives in the family home in North Salinas.

Glenda and I will seriously consider attending the '64 Reunion. We are planning to be in Salinas for the Rodeo this year. I haven't been to the California Rodeo since I was a junior at North High. Personally, I'd rather attend the Calgary Stampede but guess we'll save that for another year. "





I'm doing video, but topside and underwater, at these pools where 55 teams of high school and college kids from around the world compete with underwater remote operated vehicles they designed and built.









### <u>To appreciate the California Rodeo Salinas in all its</u> <u>giddy-up glory,</u>

<u>a spectator-cowpoke</u> needs to plant one pointy boot in the present and the other in the event's distant and dusty past.

No better place to visit that past than to step onto on the bunkhouse-like cedar flooring of the California Rodeo Heritage Museum. That's next to the arena, and it's open to the public during Rodeo days.

"What we have in that museum is a gem, a jewel," said Anne Bramers, who is chairwoman of the museum. "What we try to do here is preserve the heritage of the rodeo and to educate people about it."


Bramers, whose family owns a ranch in the Corral de Tierra area, took over management of the museum 22 years ago, and she remains attentive to its every western detail.

"Some people, for example, wanted this museum floor shiny," Bramers said. "I said, 'Not on my watch!"

Shiny floors, after all, were not a feature of the rough-hewn American West.

Displays at the museum include <u>strands of barbed wire</u> in all their inventive thorniness. <u>Century-old photos</u> capture high-flying arena action. Several <u>saddles</u> include the one Jesse Stahl used. A working cowboy, a man able to toil in the branding-iron, high-noon heat of San Ardo, Stahl became t<u>he first African</u> <u>American to ride in the Rodeo.</u> A 1914 <u>photo captures him and his bucking horse</u>, an airborne duo suspended in space and time.


Among the <u>wild clown outfits, each one capable of triggering homicidal fantasies in</u> <u>any snorting, mean-spirited bull, is one worn by Rob Smets</u>. A popular wrangler/bullfighter, Smets was a <u>Palma High School graduate</u>. Now retired and living in Texas, he was awarded five Wrangler Bullfight Tour world records. <u>He's</u> <u>featured on this year's Rodeo poster by artist Ash Cooper.</u>



Funded by donations, such as those from the Harden Foundation and also Wells Fargo Co., the museum's mission reaches beyond rodeo-goers, Bramers said. Open by appointment most of the year, the museum during two weeks in May also hosts 900 area school children. "When we get children in here, we have weavers and spinners and knitters set up," Beamer said. "We want to give the kids a taste of what women did back in those early days. The woman who put on the demonstrations explain it, and the students are mesmerized."

During this year's Rodeo, Leslie Martins, a Salinas artist who works in silver, leather and turquoise will exhibit, in the museum, pieces from her collection that were inspired by the West.

The Rodeo dates to the early 1900s. At first, it was billed as a "Wild West Show." Not until 1911 was the first Rodeo held, a week-long festivity.



Ilene Tuttle is the museum's exhibit curator. Among other things, Tuttle is known for her displays at the Monterey Peninsula Airport, where she's been creating them since 1985.

The museum does have a centerpiece. That would be its red-and-yellow replica of a Wells Fargo stagecoach, a vehicle that flew across the land on wooden-spoked wheels. For \$300, equivalent to \$7,000 today, it hauled passengers from Atchison, Kansas, to Sacramento, a spine-jarring 21-day ride across pitted prairies, rivers swift and cold and up rocky trails.



"I told Ilene we needed to

tell a story of that trip, and she came up with a mural idea, which does it beautifully," Bramers said. The mural depicts the stage route, simply and vividly. Photos of the terrain and wildlife en route help bring it to life.

Next up, when funds appear, is a re-design of the museum entrance, which Tuttle is working on. It might feature mannequins in historical garb near the door and a cross-section sampling of items in the greater display.One major frustration has to do with capacity, Bramers said. Donors continue to offer Rodeo-related items. Be it vintage saddle or strands of barbed wire, each piece is a part of the Rodeo story. Problem is there's no more room to store things and no more room to expand, Bramers said.One thing does have spaced reserved. That would be a clown barrel, Bramers said.



"A barrel would really help tell the story," she said. Reprinted from the SalinasCalifornian, July ,2012
